

LOCAL RULES (for additional temporary rules see notice board)

Out of Bounds (Rule 18)

- a) Taking a drop from out of bounds is not allowed. Stroke and distance relief must be taken.
- b) Beyond any boundary hedge or fence bounding the course.
- c) On or over any white line/stakes to the right of the 1st, 2nd, 11th, 12th, 14th and 18th fairways, behind the 2nd and 5th greens, on or over the road leading to the clubhouse, behind and to the left of the 13th green and in the quarry to the left of the 17th fairway.
- d) The car park and clubhouse surrounds and the driving range.

Internal Out of Bounds on 4th Hole, a ball lying to the left of the irrigation lake or white stakes is out of bounds. The white stakes shall not be treated as OOB when playing hole 6.

Free Relief from yardage markers.

Penalty Areas (Rule 17)

- a) On the 1st hole when a ball is played into the yellow penalty area, a player may, in addition to the options listed under rule 17.1.d, elect to use the drop zone located adjacent to the path right of the ladies' tee under penalty of one stroke.
- b) On the 5th hole, the area between the safety fence and out of bounds is a red penalty area. Relief is available under rule 17.1. However, when a ball lies in this penalty area free relief from the safety net is not available (see Obstructions).
- c) Any ball lying in the water penalty areas on the 4th, 5th, 6th and 8th holes must not be retrieved or played from anywhere within these penalty areas. A ball must be dropped outside the penalty area in accordance with the rules under penalty of one stroke.

Ground under Repair (Rule 16)

- a) Deep tractor ruts, ground inadequately restored as a result of course workings and abnormal ground conditions encircled by a white line may be treated as G.U.R and relief without penalty taken under rule 16.1b.
- b) When a ball comes to rest on any green other than the one being played, relief must be taken under rule 14.3. This includes both the practise and temporary greens.
- c) Should a pre-cut or plug hole interfere with the line of your putt or stance then relief may be taken under rule 16.1d.

Obstructions (Rules 15 and 16)

- a) Hoop protections near the greens are movable objects obstructions and relief may be taken under rule 15.2.
- b) Young trees staked or protected with their plastic guard, artificial roads, shale paths, stones on drainage ditches, protective fences (on the 5th and 8th tees and the perimeter of the driving range), seats, waste bins, ball washers, bells and distance markers are to be treated as immovable obstructions and relief taken under rule 16.1b.
- c) Relief from immovable objects including sprinkler heads close to the putting green may be taken under rule 16.1b providing it is on the line of play, within two club lengths of the green and within two club lengths of the ball.
- d) All yellow and red stakes and marker posts on the course are immovable objects from which free relief is allowed under rule 16.1. Relief is not to be taken under rule 15.2. They must not be removed.

PENALTY FOR BREACH OF LOCAL RULES

Match play loss of hole; Stroke play penalty two strokes

GENERAL

- a) There are markers on the fairways at 200 yards (white), 150 yards (yellow) and 100 yards (red) to the centre of the green.
- b) Players must replace divots, smooth bunkers and repair pitch marks on the greens. Trolleys should not be taken onto either tees or greens, including the immediate surrounds. If a group fails to keep its place on the course and loses more than one clear hole with the players in front it must allow the following match to pass if requested.
